Forestry Field Day

4-H youth from ten counties attended the 4-H Forestry Field Day at Mammoth Cave National Park on September 6 & 7, 2022. The more than 60 youth had the opportunity to learn about Kentucky's trees and forests as well as some of the skills that real-life foresters utilize everyday while on the job. The youth aged 9 to 13 (Juniors) and 14 to 18 (Seniors) years of age were taught and tested on the basics of tree identification, tree measurement and the use of a compass and measuring distances by pacing. The instructors for the Forestry Event were foresters from the University of

Kentucky Department of Forestry and Natural Resources, the Kentucky Division of Forestry and naturalists with Mammoth Cave National Park. U.K. Forestry and Natural Resources Extension and Allen, Barren, Daviess, Hart, Hardin, LaRue, Monroe, Nelson, Simpson and Warren Counties Cooperative Extension Service hosted the event.

Issues Conference


